### THE CHALLENGE:

The U.S. HeartRescue Project has provided a model for community-based improvement that has gained interest from other regions of the world. The HeartRescue strategy to adapt science into practical implementation programs has produced an accelerating movement around the globe, bringing together leaders to work together to champion improvement.

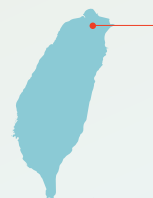
### THE RESPONSE:
